Last week, we celebrated Teachers' Day and we take the opportunity to reflect on the role of teachers. In MGS, we aspire to be a top school where the teachers are energetic, enthusiastic, ethical, disciplined, and inspirational for all the students while our students are persistent in seeking after knowledge and give their best effort in all their undertakings.

A teacher is like a farmer. A good farmer is able to create and provide the conducive environment for seeds and plants to grow, irrespective of the original situation. An example is taking the rubber seeds from Brazil to grow in England. Brazil has an equatorial and tropical climate with frequent rainfall and high temperature which is suitable for rubber seeds to grow. England has a much cooler temperate climate with a mild winter which is not suitable for cultivating rubber plants.

However, in 1876, Henry Wickham brought some rubber seeds to the Royal Botanic Gardens at Kew in London.

The able gardeners there were able to create the environment for the rubber seeds to grow. Some of the saplings were brought to Kuala Kangsar, Perak, and from there it spread to the other parts of the

country, making Malaya, at one stage, the biggest world producer of rubber.

A good teacher, like the farmer should be able to create the environment for every student to learn and grow to achieve their potential by reflecting and innovating their pedagogical practices. We believe every child can learn and we will not give excuses when students are not learning. This was a major struggle for social justice that took place mainly during the 1950s and 1960s for Black Americans to gain equal rights under the law in the United States. Despite the turbulent public life he faced, he was personally and privately known as a kind, generous man who reached out to the needy. He consistently helped under-privileged children and fed the poor. He sponsored a turkey-give-away and a book-give-away every year at Christmas. When hospitalised with pneumonia, James Brown left his hospital bed, went out in the cold rain to give out toys to needy children and

Unfortunately, James Brown's illustrious career is heavily tarnished by accounts of domestic abuse. All the strong work ethic and awards in the world can never make amends for his unacceptable behaviour and repair the damage it caused to his family and his legacy.

died the next day on Christmas Day in 2006.

This example is precisely why Matrix International School, although committed to hard work and academic success, has the first of its four core values as 'Everyone Caring'. This is to ensure students have the right character and attitude, to leave school and make a positive contribution to society.

We all know 'hard work' can lead to success in one way or another. In any field, discipline, sport, hobby or academic endeavor. As a prolific singer, songwriter, dancer and bandleader, James Brown was a pivotal force in the music industry, and undoubtedly left his mark on music history. Brown began his professional music career in 1956 and rose to fame during the late 1950s and early 1960s on the strength of his thrilling live performances. He continued to score hits in every decade through to the 1980s.

He was born into extreme poverty during the Great Depression in the 1930s in America and experienced a disadvantaged and troublesome childhood. However, in his own words, he "...had the determination to go on, and my determination was to be somebody", and made no excuses.

He and his band would perform 350 nights out of the year, night after night, breaking box-office records in every major venue in America. James Brown earned the nickname "Mr. Dynamite" and title "The Hardest Working Man in Show Business."

Sometimes he was singing and dancing so hard that he would lose several pounds in one night. Once, when he collapsed during a performance, he was diagnosed with low-salt syndrome. He had actually sweated too much and had to undergo intravenous therapy. Brown also played a major role in the Civil Rights Movement.

Guru merupakan petani. Seorang petani yang baik mampu mencipta dan menyediakan persekitaran yang kondusif untuk benih dan tumbuhan berkembang, tanpa mengira keadaan asal. Contohnya mengambil benih getah dari Brazil dan menanamnya di England. Brazil mempunyai iklim khatulistiwa dan tropika dengan hujan yang kerap dan suhu tinggi yang sesuai untuk benih getah tumbuh. England mempunyai iklim sederhana yang lebih sejuk dengan musim sejuk yang sederhana yang tidak sesuai untuk penanaman pokok getah.

Walau bagaimanapun, pada tahun 1876, Henry Wickham, membawa beberapa biji getah ke Royal Botanic Gardens di Kew di London. Tukang kebun yang berkebolehan di sana dapat mewujudkan persekitaran untuk benih getah tumbuh. Sebahagian daripada anak pokok itu dibawa ke Kuala Kangsar, Perak dan dari situ ia berkembang ke kawasan lain di negara ini, menjadikan Tanah Melayu, pada satu peringkat, pengeluar getah terbesar dunia.

Time and Place, Earth and Space

Our Year 3 students recently started a new IPC unit called 'Time and Place, Earth and Space'. In this unit, they will be learning about the importance of the Sun to our universe, including providing light and heat, being at the centre of our solar system and helping us tell the time. They will also be looking at how the moon and the stars, which have fascinated man since the beginning of time, contribute to our understanding of time and place. What is the connection between the sun, moon and stars and how we keep time here on earth?

Both classes will need to be scientists and geographers in order to find out how the movements of these heavenly bodies in space determine the way we organise our time here on earth and how they can help us define our location on the globe. Also, they will be historians, finding out about how man explained the apparent movement of the sun and the moon in the sky and kept track of time in the past.

For the first science task, the students learned how light travels through different objects. They shone a beam of light onto a white wall or screen with 3 different objects - an opaque one, a translucent one and a transparent one - placed one at a time in the path of the beam to observe the shadows they make. The children then were given the chance to explain how shadows are formed using their understanding.

They discovered that darker, more defined shadows indicate that the light has been mostly blocked, and that lighter shadows, or shadows that contain some distortion or colour, indicating that the light has travelled through, but has been changed in the process. No shadow, or very little, indicates transparent materials that light has travelled through and been left practically unchanged.

Silver said, "We can make the shadow longer by changing the angle the light shines on the object."



Adi and Yudhistir said, "The keychain is translucent and forms a light shadow. They were surprised to see the colour of the kevchain on the white wall.



Harshini and Dheyrav said, "When we shone the beam of the light lower down, we can see the longest shadow of the translucent water bottle."



Kaitlynn and Lisa said, "The cardboard is an opaque object and forms a dark shadow."
