



DEALING WITH PRESCHOOLERS BEHAVIOUR PROBLEM

MESSAGE FROM MS ADRINNA (HEAD OF PRESCHOOL)

We are into the 3rd month of schooling and we can see our preschoolers are well settled in and are aware that preschool is now part of their daily lives.

As children get comfortable, the school setting becomes their second home and the teachers are no longer their stranger and this is where they will test their boundaries by misbehaving.

However certain behaviour in young children are age-appropriate and shouldn't be immediately attributed to malice or poor temperament and we don't have to fuss about it.

Misbehaviour happens when children lack sleep, hungry, feeling rejected or unloved, and lack of confident or are discouraged

So Parents fret not!

It's natural to find your child's behaviour challenging at times. Understand the reasons behind your child's behavior so that you can deal with it effectively. Give your children love, encouragement, and approval, as these reinforce good behavior.

Change schedules to develop good health habits if misbehaviour is due to tiredness, and use more encouraging words and fewer "put-downs" if it results from lack of confidence.

Love your child as they are and separate the child from the behavior, love the child but reject the behavior. Set rules and it is very important that you are consistent with it and ensure age-appropriate consequences. Avoid punishing your child with physical discipline (e.g. smacking), shouting or isolation as it can be harmful. It is easier to prevent misbehaviour than it is to deal with it afterwards. You need a plan in order to prevent problems. Here are some suggestions from an article that I think would be very helpful "control your own behaviour first" :

Ask yourself —

- Do I use more "do's " than "don'ts"?
- Are my rules reasonable?
- Am I consistent in enforcing rules?
- Do I make it easy for my child to behave well?
- Do I let my child make choices?
- Do I give a few minutes' warning before stopping play?
- Do I provide interesting play things

Young children's behaviour is a reflection of their state of mind. Sometimes their misbehaviour may not necessarily mean they are resorting to it willingly. As a parent, it is up to us to find out the root cause of such behavior and correct it during the early stages. After all, your children need you the most when they are fighting with their emotions.

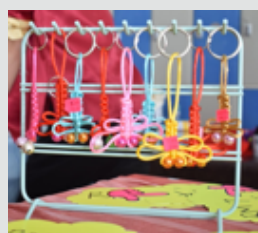

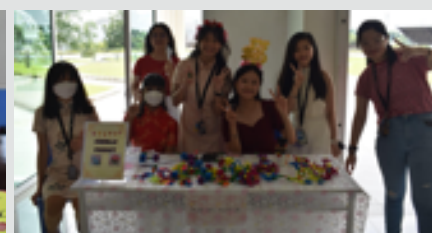


