

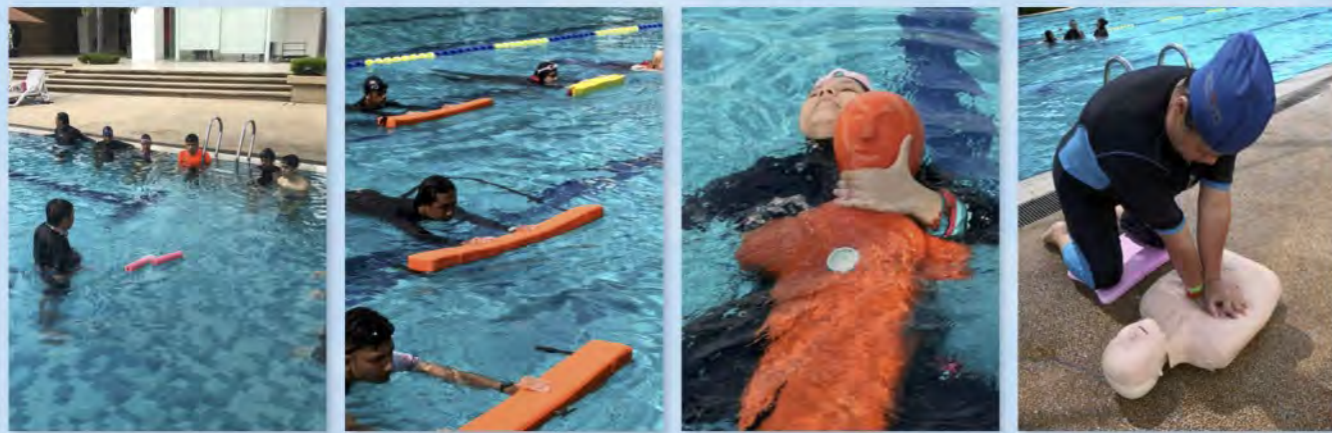


**LIFE SAVING COURSE for MGS Staff**

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**FROM THE MGS TRANSFORMATION TEAM**

On 16 Jan 2019, Matrix Global Education Sdn Bhd signed a joint venture with Bonanza Educare Sdn Bhd to set up a new entity to administer the school. We are pleased to announce that the approval from the Ministry of Education has just been received for this change of entity from Matrix Global Education Sdn Bhd to Matrix Educare Sdn Bhd effective 15 July 2019.

In accordance with this change of entity, all parents will be issued a letter of this change together with a letter of acceptance of the change by mid-August. The signed acceptance letter from parents will need to be submitted to the Admissions office by 13 Sept 2019.

Along with this change of entity, the school has also initiated a more rigorous security measure to ensure the safety of our students in school. A new access card will be issued to all parents/guardians to be collected between Monday, 19 Aug to Friday, 13 Sept 2019 from the Admissions office. This new card requires a photograph of the registered parent/parents/guardian. For those who have not submitted their photographs, the Admissions office will contact you for them as they are required for this new card. This card/tag has to be worn at all times when you are in the school compound effective from Tuesday, 17 Sept 2019. A grace period of about 4 weeks will be given for all parents to switch from the old to the new access cards. After this date, all old access cards will be immobilized and access to the school compound will be denied. Any personnel not wearing this tag or a visitor's tag in the school compound will then be requested to register with the receptionist to get a visitor's tag. We need your co-operation in this matter to ensure the safety of your children in school.

The invoices for the new term will be sent out to your child/children together with information on the change of entity, and

a form to update your contact details and personal particulars. Fees need to be settled according to the date in the invoice.

For the duration of four weeks from 19 Aug to 13 Sept 2019, we request your presence at our Admissions office to attend to the following matters:



Return the signed acceptance letter regarding the change of entity from Matrix Global Education Sdn Bhd to Matrix Educare Sdn Bhd.

Collect your new parents' access card that will be effective from 17 Sept 2019. Please bring along your old card to be exchanged for the new one.

Return the form that contains your updated contact details and personal particulars.

Whilst the old cards can still gain you access to the school until 16 Sept, we would advise all parents to bring in their old tags to exchange for new ones as soon as possible. The sooner we have this procedure in place, the better it is for the safety of our students.

All these changes have been made with the view to improving our care and concern for the welfare of our students. We thank you for your support and co-operation in helping us improve our system and procedures in school.
